This heritage derives from the past centuries when Norman population arrived in Sicily, conquered the island however accepted the local civilization that was integrated. ArcheOfficina, in collaboration with the speleological guides of CAI Palermo, organizes the guided tour. The Qanat (Arabic: قنات, qanāt) are the result of an impressive hydraulic engineering work, begun during the Muslim domination in Sicily and especially in the capital, the Medina (Palermo), to irrigate the fertile fields of the Genoardo and Conca d'Oro. This technique, of Persian origin, consisted in the excavation of very deep channels in the friable limestone bank, in order to intercept the aquifer and bring the water to the surface. Like so many other Islamic technological acquisitions, given the good efficiency of this hydraulic system, the qanats continued to be excavated even during the Norman domination and beyond, up to the most recent of the sixteenth century.

The necessary equipment will be provided by the organization (helmet, harness, boots). Since the canals are immersed in water for about 50 cm, we recommend sportswear with a waterproof jacket, and a change of pants and socks. Tickets **€15 for students and €10 for teachers**.
